


# HOW TO REGISTER FOR THE LSAT


Go to <http://www.lsac.org/australia.asp> and click on 'Login to LSAC Account'



  - This is the LSAC account number you need to fill in your Melbourne JD application to allow us to retrieve your results from LSAC directly once you have sat the LSAT.

# HOW TO REGISTER FOR THE LSAT

3. Pick your Centre Location (i.e. where you would like to sit the test) and click submit
4. Pick your Test Date and click submit
5. Click on the Test Centre of your choice and you will automatically be taken to the confirmation page.
6. If the information on the confirmation page is correct, click on 'Add to Cart'
  - Click on the question mark (if available) if you're unsure what it's asking
  - 'US/Canadian Bachelor's Degree-granting Institution' and 'Prelaw Information' details are not needed for application to the Melbourne JD.
7. If you have a credit card ready, you can click on 'continue to Checkout'
  - If you choose not to check out at this time, the items will remain in your shopping cart for 24 Hours (after this time, you have to register again)
  - If you log out once registering and would like to come back to pay within the 24 hour window, log in and click on 'Cart' at the top right hand corner
  - Please note that the amount shown for the test is in **American Dollars**
8. Read the notices in the Shopping Cart page
9. Click on the box once you have read the identification requirements for admission to the test centre and click 'Checkout'
10. You will then be taken to a secure website to pay for the test
11. Once you have paid, you will be taken to a page where you can download a **PDF** copy of your test ticket.
  - If you do not have a **PDF** reader or printer or both, you can log out and log in to the website on another computer that is able to print out your ticket. Once you log in, hover over 'LSAT' and click on 'LSAT Status'. You should be able to click on your test to bring up your **PDF** ticket.
